# NDMC LAWYER'S MURDER CASE Owner of 4-star hotel and 6 held

The Delhi Police on Wednesday arrested six people, including the owner of a four-star hotel, in connection with the murder of a 57-year-old estate officer of the New Delhi Municipal Council (NDMC) on May 16, a day before he was scheduled to pass the final order on the hotel's lease terms.

"Apprehending an unfavourable order, which would have resulted in huge monetary loss and eviction from the property, the hotel owner, Ramesh Kakkar, hatched the conspiracy to eliminate Khan, who was known to be straight and fair in his job," Special Commissioner of Police (Law & Order/South) P Kamraj said.

The NDMC had sealed the property last year and resumed its possession after the hotel authorities failed to abide by the eviction order following expiry of the lease. The other party had then taken the matter to the court, police said.

On the direction of the High Court, Khan was made the Estate Officer and he was to pass the final order in the lease matter, which is a quasi-judicial action, on May 17.

Khan's family claimed that there was tremendous pressure on him from his seniors to waive the penalty of around ₹140 crore imposed on the hotel for violation of license term, a matter which is still being probed by police.

To execute the plan, Kakkar (48) contacted Ram Phool (46) and Israil (31), both former employees (bouncers) at Kakkar's nightclub in Greater Kailash area, which closed down around five years ago.

The contract for killing was fixed for a mere ₹2 lakh, of which ₹50,000 was paid in advance. Soon, others identified as Saleem Khan (29), Amar Abti (24), Anwar Omis (21) and Bilal were roped in.

"While six of the accused were arrested, Bilal, who was the first to be identified by police, is absconding," Joint Commissioner of Police (south-east) RP Upadhyay said.

Saleem, who is a recovery agent by profession, and Amar, a known character in Jamia Nagar, allegedly helped in the logistics and were monitoring the execution of the plan. According to police officials, they are investigating the matter from

## Khan's replacement sought 10 days before murder

Ten days before an NDMC estate officer was shot dead, his Vice Chairman Karan Singh Tanwar had written to Lieutenant-Governor Najeub Jung demanding his replacement, alleging that his illegal and biased handling of a case was causing loss to the civic body.

The case in point was that of a group of hotels including 'The Connaught'. The deceased, Mohammed Moiz Khan, a lawyer and an assistant legal advisor with the NDMC, was supposed to pass the final order on the property's lease terms on May 17.

"I want to bring to your attention the working of Estate Officer MM Khan who is behaving in an arbitrary and unjust manner in a case under his examination

relating to Prominent Hotels Ltd. He is paying scant attention to the High Court order asking him to consider the contentions of the party but he is following instructions of higher officials and acting in a biased and illegal manner in favour of NDMC," Tanwar said in the letter sent to the L-G on May 6.

"But his actions will cause huge loss to the NDMC as well. It will not be out of context to mention that the same official has been under CBI investigation in different matters before. I request you to call records of estate officer's proceedings and appoint another official," he added.

The NDMC had sealed the property, which is a unit of Prominent Hotels Limited, last year and taken over its possession after the hotel authorities failed to abide by the eviction order following

expiry of the lease. The hotel owners had then taken the matter to the court.

On the direction of the High Court, Khan was made the Estate Officer and he was to pass final order in the lease matter, which is a quasi-judicial action, on May 17. Khan's family claimed that there was tremendous pressure on him from his seniors to waive penalty of around ₹140 crore imposed on the hotel for violation of licence term, a matter which is still being probed by police.

Police have questioned Khan's colleagues who claimed he was a honest officer and forthright in his dealings. The investigators, however, came to know that Khan was once suspended by the NDMC on charges of misconduct 11 years ago.

all angles and some NDMC officials are likely to be questioned.

Police have also come across allegations that the hotel owner had sent his "agents" to bribe the slain official but there was no evidence as yet to substantiate it.

An official privy to the investigation said, "A liaison agent had approached Kakkar

earlier this year and claimed that he could settle the matter at less than one-third the amount imposed as penalty. The agent had claimed before Kakkar that he had done a settlement in Chanakyaपुरi before. When the agent failed to persuade Khan and that the final date for the order approaching fast, Kakkar decided to eliminate the officer.

The plan was meticulously given shape in 10 days and May 16 was chosen as the day to go for the kill!"

The gang conducted multiple reconnaissance in the area and tracked Khan's movements for days before shooting him.

During investigation, it emerged that the property on which Connaught hotel is functioning was taken on

lease for setting up a 2-star youth hostel but the plan was changed and a hotel came up instead, attracting action from the civic body.

The arrested persons are being interrogated and efforts are on to nab the seventh accused. Also, ₹49,000 of the advance amount has been recovered, DCP (South-east) M S Randhawa said.

# Govt transfers over dozen bureaucrats

(South West) was transferred as Deputy Commissioner (West), SS Ghoshrota, a 2002 batch officer was transferred as member (Delhi SSB) relieving Ashutosh Kumar of the additional charge. Ghoshrota is currently holding the charge food and civil supplies as special commissioner.

Member Secretary (Delhi Pollution Control Committee) Kulnand Joshi has been appointed as Deputy Commissioner (East). Joshi would also hold the additional charge of Deputy Commissioner

# Can't interfere in notifications on taxi & auto fares, says High Court

Leaving it to the Delhi Government to see if the notifications on taxi and auto rickshaw fares were properly followed, the Delhi High Court on Wednesday said it cannot interfere into it and the issue has to be regulated by the concerned authorities.

The court said this while hearing an application filed by auto rickshaw drivers in which they alleged that app-based cab aggregators, like Uber and Ola, were charging much less than the fare fixed in government notifications affecting their livelihood.

"If auto rickshaws or cabs are not charging properly, how can a court interfere in it," said Justice JR Midha, adding, "How can courts regulate all this? This has to be done by the authorities."

The court further said it was of the prima facie view that the Government should look into it and it would not be appropriate for the court to regulate the implementation of notifications. "The Government is empowered to do whatever is necessary. This court cannot interfere," the court said.

# Land owners, IndiaMart officers booked in Ghaziabad inferno case

Three FIRs have been registered against the land owners and IndiaMart officers in relation to the fire incident that occurred on Saturday last week causing death of five executives. The FIRs have been registered for causing death by negligence and other relevant Sections of IPC, including forging documents to rent out the building under commercial usage.

The first FIR was lodged by police post-in-charge Jai Prakash Mehta against the building owner, his son and the branch manager of the IndiaMart. In this FIR Section 420 of IPC was applied against the building owner in addition to 304 (a) (Causing death by negligence) of IPC which was registered on May 15.

The second FIR was lodged by Ratna Dwivedi, the mother of the victim Ritam Dwivedi, against the owner of the building and IndiaMart branch

Manager Abhishek Mehta. In this FIR section 304 (a) was applied. This FIR was registered on May 17.

The third FIR was registered on Wednesday by the father of the deceased Chandra Prakash Tyagi. In this FIR, the complainant named the building owner Radheshyam Sharma, his son Rajnesh Sharma, branch manager Abhishek Mehta and the India Mart owner Dinsh Agrawal. In this FIR only 304 (a) was applied.

"The land owner of the IndiaMart building was found at fault. The plot number R-14/6 was sold for residential purpose by the GDA. The present owner bought the plot from a private person. He applied for the compound and deposited ₹5 lakh as requisite fee. But his request was turned down. The plot owner had been penalised for conducting commercial activities against the land use in the past," said GDA Secretary Ravindra

Gooble. Earlier the five IndiaMart executives were killed and six were injured in the tele-marketing company office when a fire broke in the building R-14/6 Raj Nagar where commercial activities were being carried in the residential building. The fire broke at 10:30 am on Saturday in posh Raj Nagar residential locality under Kavi Nagar police station of this city.

"We have ordered a magisterial enquiry in to the incident" said the District Magistrate Vimal Kumar Sharma.

As the fire broke out flames started reaching to first floor where IndiaMart executives were busy in their telemarketing job. The fire was so intense that it blocked the only passage to come to ground floor, said eyewitnesses. Finding no way to exit, the two executives broke open the window and jumped. One Piyush God led on the spot.

# AAP MLA gets bail in vandalising case

A Delhi court granted bail to AAP legislator Alka Lamba on Wednesday in a case of alleged trespassing and vandalising a shop and obstructing police from performing their duty last year.

Metropolitan Magistrate Abhishek Malhotra granted bail to Lamba on furnishing of a personal bond of ₹10,000 and surety of like amount. Further hearing will be conducted on June 3.

Lamba was earlier summoned as accused in the case by the court and had taken cognisance and charge sheet filed by police against her.

She was charged for obstructing public servant



in discharge of public function), 353 (assault or criminal force to deter public servant from discharge of his duty), 427 (mischief causing damage to property), 451 (house-trespass) and 34 (common intention) of the IPC.

It is stated in the charge sheet that on August 9, 2015, Lamba along with some other persons committed trespass in the shop of complainant and

threw cash bill machine, vandalised the counter and obstructed and deterred the police personnel.

An FIR was lodged against the AAP MLA from Kamla Chowk on August 10 last year, a day after she had received heavy injuries in a stone-pelting attack during her anti-drug campaign in the Kashmere Gate area.

The case was registered at Kashmere Gate Police Station on a complaint by traders including the proprietor of a sweet shop, Shiv Mishthan Bhandari.

The case was lodged against Lamba after a video clip emerged in which she was allegedly seen vandalising shops along with some of her supporters.

# Nirankari chief's funeral chokes city

Heavy traffic was experienced in parts of Delhi on Wednesday due to the funeral procession of spiritual leader, Satguru Baba Hardev Singh, head of the Sant Nirankari mission, at Nigam Bodi Ghat.

According to the Delhi Traffic Police, traffic had to be diverted at various locations due to the procession, which led to long trail of vehicles. The funeral passed through Burari Chowk, Outer Ring road, Kingsway Camp, Delhi University Metro station, IP College, Chandni Ram Akhara, Ring Road and ISBT to reach Nigam Bodi Ghat.

The procession of the spiritual leader, who had died in a road accident in Canada on Saturday, was carried out between 8 am and 12 in the afternoon. Hundreds of followers set up tents and took part in the funeral procession. Traffic was mostly affected at Kingsway Camp, Mall Road, Burari Road, Mulamba Chowk, Kashmere Gate, Libaspur and other nearby roads.

Earlier, the traffic police had issued an advisory asking people to avoid Mall Road from Azadpur Terminal to IP College from 8 am to 2 pm. Commuters were also advised to avoid Outer Ring Road passing through Burari as well as Burari Road from Kingsway Camp Chowk to Sant Nagar.
