Cyanide leak: China explosion zone evacuated

Toll touches 104

Chinese authorities have ordered the evacuation of a 3-kilometre zone around the northern port city of Tianjin over chemical contamination fears from blasts and fires that continue to rage.

Police and military staff are deployed at checkpoints leading to the explosion site, and helicopters are hovering above.

The death toll from blasts that began at a warehouse storing hazardous materials has reached 104, including 21 firefighters. Burning flames were still visible on Saturday, and explosions have been reported by witnesses and state media.

Authorities are yet to determine the full list of chemicals on site. State media say there are large amounts of sodium cyanide, which is combustible upon contact with water.

The Peoples Daily newspaper tweeted that the authorities had been sent to handle highly toxic sodium cyanide, which had been found there.

Officials had until then only confirmed the presence of calcium carbide, potassium nitrate and sodium nitrate. Calcium carbide reacts with water to form the highly explosive acetylene.

Officials have so far insisted that air and water quality levels are safe. The chemical sodium cyanide is white crystalline or granular powder, which can rapidly fatal if inhaled or ingested, as it interferes with the body's ability to use oxygen.

Iran's hardliner says Supreme Leader opposes nuclear deal

Iran's Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei opposed to a landmark nuclear deal reached with world powers, a prominent hardliner claimed on Saturday.

Hossein Shariatmadari, editor of the daily newspaper Kojouhar and a representative of Khamenei, made the comments in an editorial on Saturday. It marked the first time someone publicly has claimed Khamenei, who has final say on all State matters, stands on the deal.

Khamenei has not publicly approved or disapproved of the deal. However, he repeatedly has offered words of support for his country's nuclear negotiators. Moderates also believe the deal would have never been reached without Khamenei's private approval.

Japan marks end of WWII under criticism

Tokyo: Japan marked the 70th anniversary of the end of World War II under criticism from China and South Korea, which said Prime Minister Shinzo Abe failed to properly apologise for Tokyo's past aggression.

In a move likely to further strain relations, a trio of cabinet ministers visited Yasukuni shrine, which neighbouring countries see as a symbol of Tokyo's militarist past. His remarks were welcomed by the US but blasted by China as a non-apology, while Pyongyang derided it as 'an unpardonable mockery of Korean people'.

3 Turkish soldiers die in PKK attack

Istanbul: Three Turkish soldiers have been killed in an attack by Kurdistan Workers' Party (PKK) rebels in southeast of Turkey, the army said.

Two more soldiers were wounded, the army said. After a series of attacks in Turkey, Ankara has launched two-pronged offensive to wipe out PKK militants in northern Iraq and southeast Turkey.

Chinese authorities have ordered the evacuation of a 3-kilometre zone around the northern port city of Tianjin over chemical contamination fears from blasts and fires that continue to rage.

Police and military staff are deployed at checkpoints leading to the explosion site, and helicopters are hovering above.

The death toll from blasts that began at a warehouse drying hazardous materials has reached 104, including 21 firefighters. Burning flames were still visible on Saturday, and explosions have been reported by witnesses and state media.

Authorities are yet to determine the full list of chemicals on site. State media say there are large amounts of sodium cyanide, which is combustible upon contact with water.

The People's Daily newspaper tweeted that the authorities had been sent to handle highly toxic sodium cyanide, which had been found there.

The discovery was confirmed by police "roughly east of the blast site" in an industrial zone. State-run Beijing News said officials had until then only confirmed the presence of calcium carbonate, potassium nitrate and sodium nitrate.

It is mostly used in chemical manufacturing, for fumigation and in the mining industry to extract gold and silver.

Phnom Penh: A prominent Cambodian opposition senator, who accused Prime Minister Hun Sen with a Facebook post, has been arrested and will be charged with treason, a Cambodian spokesman has said.

Senator Heng Sok Hea was accused of treason by Hun Sen for posting a treaty that purported to show Cambodia's former head of state Heng Samrin planning to dissolve the Cambodian-Vietnam border in 1978. The Cambodia Daily newspaper reported.

ISIS 'BEHEADS' 12 IN BATTLE FOR LIBYA'S SIRTE

Tripoli: ISIS group jihadists have beheaded 12 people and hung them on crosses during a battle for the coastal city of Sirte, the national news agency LANA reported on Saturday.

The fighting for control of Sirte, hometown of slain dictator Moammar Gadhafi, has been raging since Tuesday, with one top Libyan diplomat warning of a 'massacre' in the city.

"I complied with Facebook's requests, as they pertained to both my interactions with the media and the handling of the code, every step of the way," Khanna told IANS in an email response, adding "My intentions were never malicious, I simply sought to draw attention to a privacy issue that I knew many people were unaware of".

"Despite being asked repeatedly to remove the code, the creator of this tool let it up. This is wrong and it's inconsistent with how we think about serving our community," Facebook said in a statement on Friday.

Concerned over privacy issues, Khanna, who based in Washington, said "I'm hopeful this story will foster conversations about how Facebook and other companies handle privacy issues, specifically, whether they take steps to proactively protect our privacy, or if it takes pressure from the outside to affect change".
