DADRILYNCHING

Meat in Akhlaque's fridge beef: Lab

In a major twist in the Dadril lynching case, a report prepared by a forensic lab in Mathura on Tuesday concluded that the meat found in the victim's house was beef, eight months after the attack triggers a fierce debate over intolerance.

The finding was in contrast to the preliminary report of an enquiry by the Uttar Pradesh Veterinary department which said the meat over which Muhammad Akhlaq, 52, was lynched on September 28 last in Dadril was mutton of goat progeny.

The revelation comes at a time when the State's Assembly polls are just round the corner and could change the political



dynamics in the communally sensitive Uttar Pradesh.

Akhlaq was lynched by a mob on the night of April 28, 2015 at Dadar's Bisara village after rumours spread that he and his family had slaughtered a cow and had consumed beef (cattle meat). The incident had triggered massive outrage across the country, with politicians, activist descending on the village to console the bereaved family. Earlier, Uttar Pradesh police had filed a charge sheet against 17 people involved in lynching case and arrested 15 people who are currently lodged in district jail.

Those arrested included son and nephew of a local BJP leader Sanjay Rana for his alleged involvement in Akhlaq's lynching. Vishal and Shivam had allegedly spread the rumour and led a violent mob

that attacked Akhlaq's house, lynched him and brutally assaulted his younger son Danish, claimed reports.

Akhlaq's son Saraz told The Pioneer: "The probe is going in the right direction but now the new revelation is only to politicise the issue in Uttar Pradesh." He further added on the new development that the lab report is not looking authentic and it is only a rumour.

"The court had given a distinct direction that any documents related to this case could not be made public till the charges on the accused have been framed," said Saraz.

According to the laws in Uttar Pradesh, slaughter of cows is illegal, while possession of beef is not.

In Kirari, 'minor' abducts 8-year-old girl sleeping at house, rapes; nabbed

An eight-year-old girl was allegedly raped by a youth who abducted her from the premise of her house, where she was sleeping on a cot outside her house at an unauthorised colony in Kirari when she was sleeping on a cot, in outer Delhi's Kirari, police said on Tuesday.

According to police, the incident took place on the wee hours of Saturday when the accused, who is suspected to be a minor and is a stranger to the girl's family, allegedly gagged the girl and took her to a secluded spot near her house where he forced himself upon her. "The accused was arrested and his age is being verified," DCP (Outer) Vikranjit Singh

said. The girl was sleeping on a cot outside her house at an unauthorised colony in Kirari when she was sleeping on a cot, in outer Delhi's Kirari, police said on Tuesday.

According to police, the incident took place on the wee hours of Saturday when the accused, who is suspected to be a minor and is a stranger to the girl's family, allegedly gagged the girl and took her to a secluded spot near her house where he forced himself upon her. "The accused was arrested and his age is being verified," DCP (Outer) Vikranjit Singh

out anyone noticing her absence.

It was her mother who raised an alarm after she saw blood stains on the bed sheet and rushed the girl to a hospital. The hospital authorities called up police and a team was rushed there. The doctors confirmed sexual assault, following which the girl was sent for counselling.

During counselling, the girl broke down and narrated her ordeal. A case under IPC Sections 363 (abduction) and 376 (rape) and relevant sections of Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act was registered immediately at Aman Vihar police station, a senior police official said.

CCTV footage from several premises in the locality were scanned by police and in one particular clip, the accused could be seen taking away the girl. He was identified within 24 hours and police started looking for him.

The accused is a stranger to the family and he lives in another lane in the same locality, said police, adding he was passing by when he spotted the girl sleeping at the cot and took advantage of the situation. He was not drunk at the time of the incident, police said.

The girl's condition is stable now. Her father works as a supervisor in a private enterprise and her mother is a housewife.

DU's online UG admissions begin today

One of the most highly rated university admission at the undergraduate level of Delhi University will begin on Wednesday. Around 60,000 seats across 70 colleges of the DU would be enrolling fresh candidates for the next academic session with the varsity going online, for the first time.

Announcing the admission policy for the upcoming academic session, Dean of Students' Welfare JM Khurana said, "As instructed by the UGC earlier this year, the university has decided to make the entire process online. While till last year there used to be an option for filling offline applications and the students had to complete the admission formalities manually after announcement of the cut-off list, from this year all of it will



be done online." The online registration process will start at 12 noon and will continue till June 19. The university has decided to only

release five cut-off lists unlike previous years with the first one being announced on June 27. The students will have three days to complete the

enrollment process following publication of each list. The merit lists for the remaining seats after admissions conclude for the fifth cut-off, will

be announced by respective colleges," Khurana said at a Press conference.

The centralised Optical Mark Recognition (OMR) forms will be available on university's website. Students will have to make the payment through internet banking. The fee for general category students is Rs 100 whereas for SC/ST students the admission form will cost Rs 50.

After registering themselves on varsity's admission portal, the students will be required to upload 'self-attested and scanned' copies of their documents after following the mentioned instructions and then make the payment online.

The varsity will also hold an 'open house' for students and parents from June 1-11 at different locations during which any queries regarding the admission process may be taken up.

Bal Bhawan's failure to advertise closure leaves children 'disheartened'

Fifteen-year-old Sheenu Sharma, who along with her father came to visit National Bal Bhawan at Koda Road near ITO on Tuesday, was one among hundreds of other students who were disheartened to know that entry to the Bhawan had been closed for general public till June 22.

A notice board hanging at the main entrance displayed that the Bhawan was closed since May 17.

Many children who had been frequenting the Bhawan are returning disheartened as the authorities have not publicised the closure dates through mass media platforms, said sources.

It caters to children between the age group of 5 and 16 years. The Bhawan is open from 9 am to 5:30 pm and is closed on Sunday, Monday and on gazetted holidays.

The Bhawan engages children in different activities like music singing, painting, rallies, discussions, creative writing and science fairs. A large number of children frequent the Bhawan to enjoy ride in the toy train and to see traffic park, laughing mirror, science park and mini zoo among other attractions.

Asked why children have been restricted for general public, a security guard at the main entrance said this has been done on the directions of the director as 'Summer Fiesta - 2016' was going on. Efforts to reach out to the authorities yielded no results.

L-G lung not clearing proposal to regularise guest teachers: AAP

Accusing LG Governor Najeeb Alung of acting as a 'puppet' of the Centre, the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) alleged he was not clearing the Delhi Government's proposal to regularise 17,000 guest teachers in State-run schools at the behest of the BJP.

It may be noted that the Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia who also holds the education portfolio, had written to Najeeb Alung raising the issue of regularising guest teachers. One of the points mentioned in AAP's decision was that Najeeb Alung should not let the L-G take any decision on the matter.

"The L-G is the Centre's representative and does not take any decision without its consultation. The BJP-led Central Government is not interested in letting him clear the proposal.



He is sitting on it since January and when we asked him about the delay in clearing the proposal, he responded saying he is taking an opinion from Solicitor General. He should not act as a puppet of the Centre. The L-G has no right to delay the matter by raising legal queries as there is a Supreme Court order on this. We demand that the proposal be cleared without any changes," Ashutosh said on Tuesday.

Sources in the L-G office said the Government had sent the proposal to the L-G office on April 28 and it has been sent to the Additional Solicitor General for legal advice after consultation with Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia.
