HATE INCIDENTS CLAIM: PROBE ORDERED Berlin: German prosecutors said on Monday they have launched a probe after receiving a complaint alleging that top Facebook bosses, including founder Mark Zuckerberg, are condoning hate speech, as pressure grows on the social network to clamp down on racist content.

PROSPECT OF CYPRUS SOLUTION 'WITHIN REACH' Mont Pelarin (Switzerland): A lasting peace deal to unify Cyprus is within reach, UN chief Ban Ki-moon said on Monday, as he opened peace talks between rival leaders from the divided island.

INDIAN MAN KILLED AS TORNADO STRIKES ITALY Rome: An Indian man was among two people who were killed after a powerful tornado hit the outskirts of the Italian capital, wounding several others.

QZ'S SAME-SEX MARRIAGE BILL VOTED DOWN Sydney: Australia's Parliament rejected the Government's proposal for a national vote on whether to legalise same-sex marriage.

ATTACK ON ISRAELIS: PALESTINIAN JAILED 12 YRS Jerusalem: An Israeli court sentenced a Palestinian teenager on Monday to 12 years in prison for a knife attack against two Israelis, his lawyer said.

E-MAL ROW: FBI CLEAN CHIT TO CLINTON

In a major relief for Hillary Clinton, the FBI on Monday said she should not face criminal charges after a review of new emails, a development that could be a game changer for the Democratic presidential candidate in her tight White House race against Donald Trump.

Based on our review, we have not changed our conclusions that we expressed in July with respect to Secretary Clinton," FBI Director James B. Comey told Congress leaders in a letter after a renewed probe into the use of a private email server as secretary of state following a cache of recently discovered emails.

The move, just ahead of the general elections tomorrow, came as a last-minute relief to the 69-year-old former secretary of state following the agency's announcement of the fresh probe that triggered a backlash from the Democratic camp and denied Clinton's popularity. Republican rival Donald Trump, who had seized on the reneiged controversy following the FBI's decision of the renewed probe, criticised the latest development, saying Clinton is being protected by a "rigged system" and that it is "unbelievable, what she gets away with".

A similar letter was sent to

the Congress on October 28 in which Comey had said the FBI has reopened the investigation following discovery of some pertinent emails on the laptop of former Congressman Anthony Weiner, the estranged husband of Clinton's close aide Huma Abedin. "Since my letter (of October 28), the FBI investigation team has been working around the clock to process and review a large vol-

TRUMP CONFIDENT OF VICTORY

WASHINGTON: Republican presidential candidate Donald Trump expressed confidence about winning the election, saying it would be "Brexit times 50", a reference to the surprising result of the UK's referendum to leave the European Union.

"You have to get everyone you can to the polls. We are going to win. We are going to have one of the greatest victories of all time. This is going to be Brexit times 50," Trump, 70, told cheering supporters in Leesburg, a suburb of Washington DC in Virginia.

His comments came as the pollsters and the media predicted a victory for Democratic nominee Hillary Clinton.

Clinton leading Trump by four points: Poll

Washington: Democratic presidential candidate Hillary Clinton is leading her Republican rival Donald Trump by four percentage points, a latest poll said today on the eve of the elections which would elect the next US President. Clinton has the support of 45 per cent of likely voters as against 41 per cent for Trump, CBS News said in its latest weekly poll. She had a similar lead over Trump in the last weekly poll.

Obama's shoes too big to fill: Clinton

Washington: Democratic presidential nominee Hillary Clinton has said she is "grateful" for the "amazing" support she got from Barack Obama and the First Lady Michelle and acknowledged that the outgoing US president is leaving "big shoes" to fill.

Clinton said Obama was not getting the credit he deserves for everything he did as the US president and for putting the country on the "right track". "I am so grateful for President Obama's leadership. I love it when he talks and I'm so grateful for all of his support in this election. Both he and Michelle have been amazing on the campaign trail," Clinton said at an election rally in Philadelphia.

Kashmiri militants plan 'surgical strike' in India: Hafiz Saeed

Jammal-ud-Dawah chief and Mumbai terror attack mastermind Hafiz Saeed has threatened India with a 'surgical strike' by Kashmiri militants in Jammu & Kashmir that will long be remembered.

"Prime Minister Narendra Modi had done what he had to. Now it is the turn of Mujahideen to carry out a surgical strike in Kashmir," Saeed threatened while addressing a rally on Sunday in Mirpur, Pakistan-occupied Kashmir.

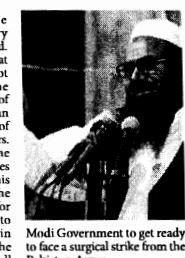
The surgical strike Mujahideen are going to carry out will long be remembered. Such a strike will not be like that of India's one which is not even acknowledged by the world."

US-backed forces push closer to ISIS 'capital' Raqqa

Ain Issa (Syria): A US-backed Kurdish force pushed closer to Raqqa and Iraqi forces seized a key town near Mosul as offensives advanced on Monday against the two Islamic State group strongholds.

After announcing the start of the long-awaited offensive on Raqqa, the Syrian Democratic Forces (SDF) alliance said it had moved south towards the city despite fierce jihadi resistance.

South of Mosul, Iraqi forces had retaken the town of Hamam al-Ahl from ISIS, a key objective in their three-week advance on the city.

Raqqa and Mosul are the last major cities in Syria and Iraq under the jihadi control and their capture would deal a knockout blow to the self-styled 'caliphate' ISIS declared in mid-2014.

The US-led coalition that launched operations against IS two years ago is providing crucial backing to the offensives, with both airstrikes and special forces advisers on the ground.

ISIS losing ground but still a threat: Analysts

The ISIS group has been eroded by international efforts to crush the jihadist group but its ability to mount devastating attacks on the West remains very real, defence and security experts say.

As France prepares to mark the first anniversary of the Paris attacks by the group on November 13, analysts say military defeats in its strongholds in Iraq and Syria will almost certainly not make its Western targets any safer.

"Depriving ISIS of control over population centres and sanctuary to raise funds and train fighters, and breaking it up as key organisation, matters," said Anthony Cordesman of the Washington-based Center for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS), using another name for the group.

"Defeating it, in any practical sense, however, will not begin to deal with the lasting threat," he added.

Panama Paper: Pak court asks Sharif family to furnish more docs

Islamabad: Dissatisfied with the replies submitted by the Sharif family to the Supreme Court on Monday gave them a week's time to furnish more documents.

The court last week had ordered Maryam, Hassan and Hussain to respond to the charges by opposition that they bought assets abroad with illegal money. The five-member bench headed by Chief Justice Anwar Zaheer Jamali took up five identical petitions by Imran Khan and other on November 1, demanding probe into the assets of those mentioned in the Panama Leaks.

Sharif had submitted his response last week through his counsel Salman Adam Butt, in which he denied any financial wrongdoing.

China's ruling bars rebel HK lawmakers to take office

In an unprecedented move, China on Monday passed a new controversial law to bar elected rebel lawmakers from taking office in Hong Kong in a bid to crush growing pro-independence movement in the former British colony.

The ruling passed by the Standing Committee of the National People's Congress, China's rubber stamp parliament, said elected members to Legislative Council (LegCo) of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (SAR) must swear allegiance to Hong Kong as part of China and those who changed their oath will be disqualified.

"When assuming office, the chief executive, principal officers, members of the executive council, members of legislative council, judges of courts at all levels and other members of the judiciary in the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region must, in accordance with law, swear to uphold the Basic Law of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region of the People's Republic of China."

And swear allegiance to the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region of the People's Republic of China," NPC said issuing official interpretation basic law of article 104 of the Hong Kong's Basic Law.

In one picture, the teenager smiles as she carries crates of tomatoes over a bridge. In another, she is talking on a mobile phone while selling tomatoes at a market.

Yemen war death toll surpasses 7,000: WHO

Yemen's 20-month-old war has left more than 7,000 people dead and nearly 37,000 wounded, the World Health Organisation announced in its latest toll update.

As of October 25, "more than 7,070 people have been killed and over 36,818 injured, according to health facility-based data," the WHO said in a statement.

Another 21 million people are in need of urgent health services, said the UN health agency. Yemen has been rocked by fighting between Iran-backed rebels and Government forces supported by a Saudi-led coalition since March 26, 2015.

In addition to the fighting, international organisations have warned in recent weeks of a spread of disease and growing rates of malnutrition in the country, which was already the Arabian Peninsula's poorest even before the war erupted.

The WHO said in its statement released from the rebel-held capital Sanaa that 2.1 million people have been internally displaced by the conflict. More than half of all health facilities across the country have been shut or are partially functioning, it said.

"There are critical shortages in medical doctors in more than 40 percent of all districts," it added.
